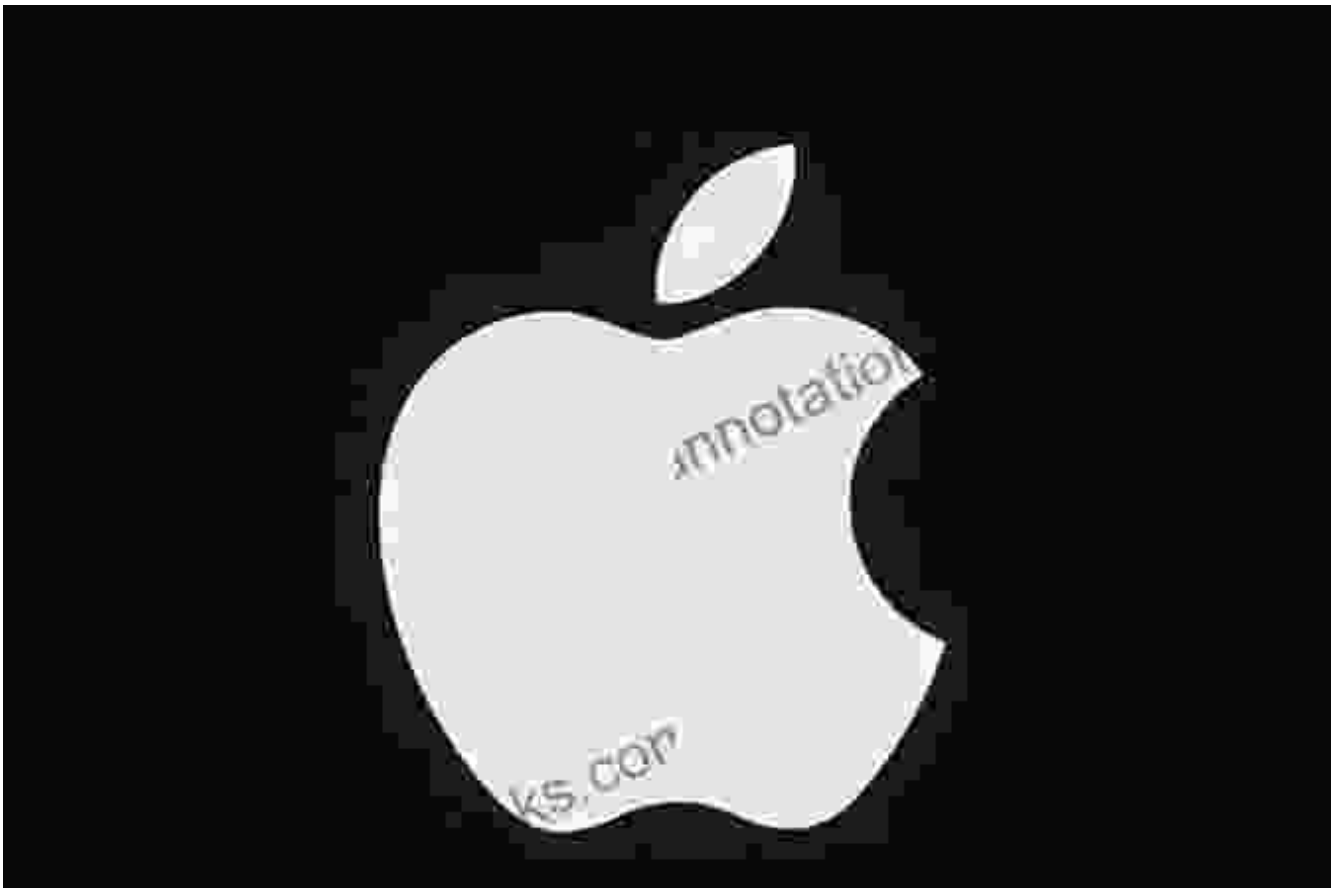
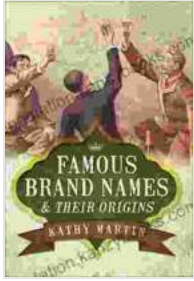

Starbucks

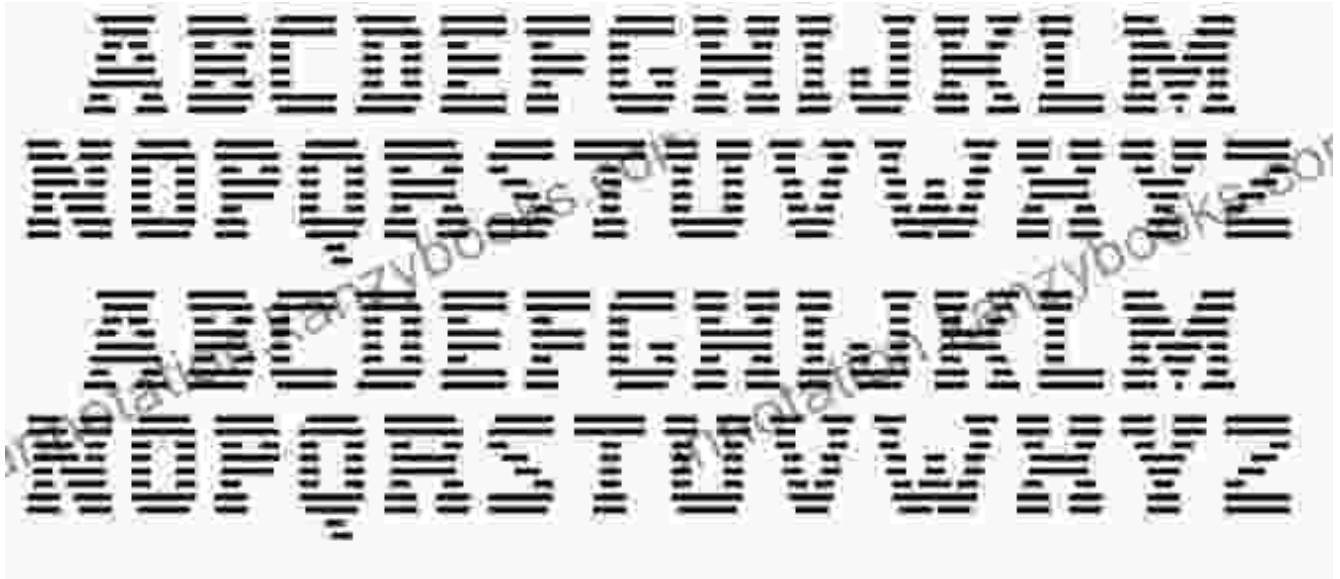
